The Officer/NCO of the Signal Detachment shall oversee the operations of the detachment, and shall report directly to the Acting Inspector-General in all matters.

The duty is similar to patrol duty: the detachment accompanies the advance of the command. They are not called upon to fight – except in self-defense. They shall operate in particular as directed by the Officer in charge and in general by the Division Commander commanding.

He shall take charge of all personnel under his department and all those detached for temporary service for duty directly related to his department.

The Signal Officer shall be responsible for procuring and maintaining radios and other equipment for use by the Division and for establishing communication with the Event Staff (medical, safety, organization, amenities, etc) and with the CSA staff as necessary.

Any Staff officer, while on duty with a detachment from the Division, cannot exercise command or give orders affecting the men without specific permission by the Division Commander to do so. Nevertheless, he has an advisory control that cannot be ignored, and it is the duty of the officer in charge of the detachment to conform to his counsel. The Staff officer gives orders in the name of the Commanding officer with reference to the character of the work, the time and means of its performance; and it is the duty of all officers to conform to these orders.
